Dear Friends In Christ,

Scrolling Facebook earlier this week, I came upon the following poem, *Autumn* by Maria Rilke:

*The leaves are falling, falling as if from far up,
as if orchards were dying high in space.*

Each leaf falls as if it were motioning "no."

*And tonight the heavy earth is falling
away from all other stars in the loneliness.*

*We're all falling. This hand here is falling.
And look at the other one. It's in them all.*

*And yet there is Someone, whose hands
infinitely calm, holding up all this falling.*

Admittedly, I was probably drawn to this poem because Autumn has always been one of my favorite seasons - no doubt in large part because of the multi-colored, falling leaves that tend to surround my feet everywhere I go this time of year.

But, perhaps, it's also because I love the shortening days as well. As much as I love the long days of sunshine during the summer, by the time Fall rolls around, I'm ready for the quietness that accompanies early sunsets that fade into the canvas of starlit skies.

Despite my love for this time of year, it wasn't until I read this poem that it occurred to me that perhaps it's that feeling of falling that causes Autumn to capture my attention and my heart every year - this year, most especially so.

As the pandemic has dragged on, it has felt a lot like we've been falling.

Falling at times into loneliness; at times, into despair.

But, at other times, falling into community and into a renewed, shared vision of the possibilities that lay before us when we finally emerge from our pandemic cocoons.

Falling, metaphorically or literally, can be scary, jarring.

At times, it's sudden and without warning and at other times, it sort of seems to happen in slow motion - as though we can see it coming and we just can't quite catch ourselves in time to prevent the fall.

But, perhaps most scary and jarring of all, is the limbo we find ourselves in as we are falling. Where will we end up? What will happen to us? Will we hurt ourselves or will we land on our feet? Of course, there's no way to know the impact the fall will have on us until we land.

Perhaps, it will be as gentle as a leaf landing on the ground or as jolting as our feet hitting the water as we fall from a diving board.

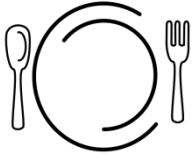
But, what is certain, is that through it all God's steadfast love and presence accompanies us with hands of infinite calmness holding us up through it all.

As we continue to arise from these days of seemingly infinite and perpetual falling, may the wisdom of Rilke's poem stay with you - reminding you that falling is a part of life; falling is something we all experience - from the leaves on the tree to the leaders of nations; and most importantly, that we never fall alone - for God's infinitely calm hands always hold us up now matter where or how we land.
